2024/25 Flu Season (up to 31 March 2025)

Please note that we will send influenza vaccination invitation out by SMS and email, with letters being used where SMS and email is not available. We ask that you await an invitation. The Adult Flu vaccination dates will be:

Sat 5th Oct 2024, Sat 19th Oct 2024, Sat 16th Nov 2024. There will be some ad hoc clinics too.

Providing the Covid vaccine arrives (due to be given from 03 October) it will be offered at the same time as Influenza where a patient is happy to have both at the same time. We will have limited appointments. The National Booking service will be open from 23 Sep 2024.

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)

This is a new vaccination being offered this year to help protect eligible patients from the RSV virus.

This is available to patients who:

- turn 75 years of age on or after 1 September 2024
- are already aged 75 to 79 years old on 1 September 2024
- All women who are at least 28 weeks pregnant (the eligible cohort) on 1 September 2024, will be offered a single dose of the RSV vaccine. After that, pregnant women will become eligible as they reach 28 weeks gestation and remain eligible up to birth (midwifery services to offer initially).

We are limited in how much vaccine we can have now so we will be inviting, as and when we can, by text. This is an on-going vaccination programme throughout the year.
